## HISTORY QUIZ ANSWER:

### 3. The ladies of the Neighbors of Woodcraft, Kinnikinick Circle, #453, Red Cliff, 1910.

Explanation: Despite the generally rough-and-tumble nature of mining camps, there was an element of culture in the early days. Both women and men signed up for social groups whose purpose often involved intellectual study and betterment of the community.

The Kinnikinick Circle (named for a trailing, pink-blossomed forest plant) was a social and philanthropic group established in 1902. The group continued meeting well into the early 1970s.
